I'm reminded of what Solomon so wisely wrote many centuries ago: "There is an appointed time for everything. And there is a time for every event under heaven—a time to give birth and a time to die; a time to plant and a time to uproot what has been planted. A time to kill and a time to heal; a time to tear down and a time to build up. A time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance. A time to throw stones and a time to gather stones; a time to embrace and a time to shun embracing. A time to search and a time to give up as lost; a time to keep and a

time to throw away. A time to tear apart and a time to sew together; a time to be silent and a time to speak...."

I think the bottom line of what Solomon shares—by divine inspiration—is simply this: *CHANGE is inevitable, so make time to do what's <u>important</u> with what you've been given while you can. Clearly, we've seen a lot of change at Northlake with staff member departures, interim ministry arrivals and search team meetings. Seasons COME, and seasons GO. Let's not cling to the past and expect always to continue doing what we've always done (how we've always done it). Rather, seek God's will to open new doors, play new roles and accept new opportunities in pursuit of His purpose to honor His Kingdom. <u>Question</u>: Are YOU serving t(H) is church that He created for <i>you*...and designed you *for*? No one should simply sit on the sidelines of ministry and *be blessed* by the efforts of others (church staff, teachers, leaders, volunteers); each should strive to *be a blessing* IN, TO and THROUGH this church. Do you know what your role(s) is/are? Is there something that remains undone because you choose to remain inactive and watch from the sidelines? The purpose of the local church is to lead us to saving faith, teach us to follow Christ, to help us know Him (intimately) through His Spirit and Word...and then to obey Him by sharing His message with others. No one gets a pass from the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) or the Great Commitment (Ephesians 4:11-16); nor should we ignore the Great Commandment (Matthew 22:34-40), which empower to do both! How does God want you to SERVE as things CHANGE?

This summer we're doing something DIFFERENT with Sunday morning Bible study: Combining into FOUR groups, pursuing four different biblical study paths (through RightNow Media). Each adult Sunday School member is asked to find one of those video-driven classes in this Summer Discipleship Effort to engage individually. Others from your class may join you, or they may opt for another option. The goal is to widen our relational awareness of Northlake members by stepping outside our SS silos for a while to grow our faith. I know it's "different," but sometimes that can be good...*so join me in taking part in this Summer study series!*
